President Barry Walter called the meeting to order at 9:05 a.m. He welcomed everyone, and especially Larry and Ginny OBrien, who, although they have been members for several months, were finally able to attend their first meeting in person. He explained the procedure for the Tool Sale, and thanked everyone for their donations to Empty Bowls and Beads of Courage. He talked about the next meeting, which will feature Chad from Turners Warehouse who will demonstrate resin casting.



27 members gathered that day. They brought their donations for Empty Bowls, recently totaling 137 pieces. As you see, we remained socially distanced and masked, but it was so good to see each other after so many months of quarantine.

Vehicles parked nose to curb so that items to be sold at the club Tool Sale could be displayed in trunk or truck bed. Members circulated informally among the vehicles.

A number of Beads of Courage bowls were also collected.

Dean Humphrey brought a trailer loaded with a variety of wood pieces that he sold at \$3.00 per pound, with all proceeds going to the PAW General Fund. Thanks to Dean for donating this wood, hauling it to the meeting and overseeing the sale, all of which added \$228 to PAW.



Empty Bowls

Empty Bowls is a fundraiser for local food banks, for which local ceramic and wood artisans donate "empty" bowls. We all know food banks are especially stressed these days. In previous years, all collected bowls are displayed on Courthouse Square on a Sunday in September. Local chefs create and donate soup. Rolls and water are also donated. A ticket buys two takeout cartons of soup, rolls and bottled water, but the best part is that the ticket allows the choice of one of the hand-made bowls on display. Every year people line up around the block to participate, and we are told that the wooden bowls are highly sought after.

As we know, most in-person events this year have been cancelled, and Empty Bowls will also be virtual. In their case, the organizers are calling it "Stone Soup" after the European folk story in which hungry strangers convince the people of a town to each share a small amount of their food in order to make a meal that everyone enjoys, and exists as a moral regarding the value of sharing.

Not on Courthouse Square this year, but rather the event will take place at the Granite Peak Unitarian Universalist Congregation on Sunday September 13, 2020 from 10:00 a.m. until 4:00 p.m. Bowls can be purchased on-line for \$15.00. As it was explained to me, folks will drive by the bowls displayed, point out the one they want, and a runner will wrap the bowl and put it in their vehicle.





Beginning with a bowl from each of our teen members, Sapphire, Travis and Savannah Murphy, this year's donation numbered **nearly 140 pieces!**
