Bruce Potter thanked everyone for the bowls already donated to the Empty Bowls event, which will take place on Courthouse Square in September. Bruce reminded everyone that August will be the last meeting at which bowls will be collected, so be sure to bring them to that meeting. As we have in the past, all the donated bowls will be displayed, along with the artists, for a picture.

At 12:15 the Tool Auction began. Ric Davis and Chuck Brown acted as auctioneers. They read from the Auction Entry Form that accompanied each tool, making each one sound like a must-have. At the end of the meeting their efforts moved most of the tools to new shops.

At the close of the auction, buyers moved about the room, finding and paying the sellers of each item.

The meeting adjourned at about 3:15 p.m.
